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HARRY BERTOIA untitled (Bush Form)

This rare and exceptionally large bush sculpture exemplifies the technical skill of Bertoia as a metalsmith. The individual branches that stem from the central support terminate at the surface, creating an undulating silhouette. Created by hundreds of individual points, the sculpture is ethereal, becoming a study of the space contained in and around the form.
