

**De Stijl, Vol XX, No. 2**, The Museum of Modern Art Bulletin, 1952. Pamphlet which accompanied a traveling exhibition organized by the Stedelijk Museum in 1951. Essays by Philip Johnson and Alfred Barr. This is the exhibition for which Rietveld's "Piet Elling" sideboard was re-made and where MoMA acquired its Red-Blue chair.—JZ

Christie's Amsterdam, 11/06/1986. Extremely rare auction catalogue, includes a collection of 20 works by Rietveld from several sources, including the Red-Blue chair from the family of Bart van der Leck, which sold for \$125,000, setting a world record for a 20th Century chair.—JZ Near Fine condition, includes anonymous handwritten notes and prices on the Rietveld lots.
