

David Joel was a furniture manufacturer and retailer, and the husband of Betty Joel, the furniture and interior designer. The focus is mostly on the conventional



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designers, such as Ambrose Heal and Gordon Russell.—JZ Dust jacket is in fragments, it is a softcover proof pre-first edition hardcover, with pasted-in illustrations and typos (Marcel Breuer is spelled Marcel Breuen for example)
