

Strictly a well-loved reference copy, with overall heavy wear, damages to the binding, ancient tape repairs to the inside back cover, with midcentury stamps of bookseller and owner.

Provenance: Collection of Michael and Gabrielle Boyd. Introduction by Edgar Kaufmann, Jr. Typography by Sybil Wilson. Influential collection of essays by Albers which were previously included in publications by MoMA, Craft Horizons, etc.—JZ Some discolorations and spotting to the pages. Minor yellowing and spotting to the covers.

Albers Werner Spies, Harry Abrams, New York, USA, 1970. 80 pages, Hardcover with dustjacket. *The classic takedown of the International Style by the famed satirical essayist.—JZ* Very good condition, dust jacket with small tears to the front and spine.

Knoll Celebrates 75 Years of Bauhaus Design, 1919-1994, Knoll Group, 1994. 100 pages, Softcover. This snazzy catalogue with aluminum nuts and bolts binding illustrates mostly Postmodern designs by a who's who of 1990s European and American architects in homage to Bauhaus originals.—JZ

La Bauhaus y el Mexico moderno: El diseño de Van Beuren Ana Mallet, Arquine, Mexico City, 2014. 100 pages. First edition with Spanish text. Introduction by Barry Bergdoll. Already rare. Important monograph on Michael Van Beuren, the American-born designer who studied architecture at the Bauhaus with Mies and Albers, then moved to Mexico, where he teamed up with Klaus Grabe and won a prize in MoMA's Organic Design for Home Furnishings exhibition.—JZ

In a Cloud, In a Wall, In a Chair: Six Modernists in Mexico at Midcentury Zoe Ryan, Art Insitute of Chicago, Yale University Press, USA, 2019. 236 pages, Hardcover. First edition. Essays by Glen Adamson, Ana Elena Mallet et al. One of the most important and profound 21st Century design publications, it introduces the furniture of Clara Porset and discusses her relationships with Lola Alvarez Bravo, Anni Albers, Ruth Asawa, Cynthia Sargent and Sheila Hicks.—JZ

Object Lessons: The Bauhaus and Harvard Laura Muir, Ed.,, Harvard Art Museums, Yale Press, 2021. 296 pages, Hardcover. First edition. A stunning publication, includes inset reproduction pamphlet of the 1930 Bauhaus exhibition at Harvard, the first in the United States.—JZ
