First edition, rare. Provenance: Dennis Johansson, Malmo, Sweden. The front cover is loose and the paper on the spine is fragile with losses. Otherwise very good.

Design in Scandinavia: An Exhibition of Objects for the Home from Denmark, Finland, Norway, Sweden Arne Remlov, editor, 1954. 125 pages, Softcover. First and only edition. Provenance: Devta Doolan, Deer Isle, Maine. A superb copy of an important and rare publication. Iconic cover and layout by Tapio Wirkkala. Organized by a committee from the four countries, the exhibition was held in 27 cities in North America from 1954 to 1963 and played a significant role in the commercial success of Nordic midcentury design.—JZ Minor foxing to a few pages and the inside back cover; several minor losses to the



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top layer of paper on the spine; ear fine condition.
